5. Emma had 60 stickers, and she gave 18 of them to her sister. After that, she received 25 more from a friend. How many stickers does she have now?
6. There are 55 cars in a parking lot. 23 of them are red, 7 are black and the rest are blue. How many cars are blue?
7. Mark has 90 marbles, and he wants to divide them equally among his 6 friends. How many marbles will each friend receive?
8. Alex has 72 trading cards, and he decided to trade 36 of them with his friend. How many trading cards will Alex have if he buys another pack containing 10 cards?
9. A grocery store had 125 apples in stock. They sold 53 apples on Monday and 29 apples on Tuesday. How many apples are left in the store?
10. There are 60 students in a school club, and 18 of them are going on a field trip. If 11 are boys How many girls are going on the trip?
